COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER (NONCREDIT) - CERTIFICATE

Community Health Worker (noncredit) - Certificate

The Community Health Worker Certificate of Completion provides students with health education, care management, and client advocacy in both community-based and health care settings. CHWs serve a two-way bridge between communities and key health and social resources. They play a vital role in reducing health inequalities among under-served communities by reducing barriers to access in a culturally appropriate way.
